

Senior Exhibition Presentation Overview 2017-2018

Format

The Senior Exhibition presentations will take place during an **after-school** event held at each individual campus. Presentations will occur within a two-week window during the following dates:

Monday, March 12, 2018	Wednesday, March 14, 2018
Monday, March 19, 2018	Wednesday, March 21, 2018

Presentations will take place between 3:00pm to 6:00pm (Local Time). Please work with your Campus Administrator to select the date and to organize the event. Depending on the class size, some events may be one to three hours in length. Once a date/time has been selected, please inform your region's Curriculum & Instructional Specialist by **Friday, March 2, 2018**. A schedule of the presentations and the order in which the students are presenting should also be created and sent. The schedules will be compiled across all regions and a master schedule will be released to the community.

A total of 15 minutes will be set aside for each student (10 minutes for presentation, 5 minutes for Q&A). During this time, members of the panel will also fill out the appropriate rubrics. In addition, there will be 3 minutes set aside for transition between each presentation.

Audience

It will be an open-invitation event; however, if a community member has a child in the 12th grade, they will be expected to attend. NLT is fully supportive of this and is encouraging full and enthusiastic participation of all those involved: parents, students, Professional Staff and Campus Administrators. In attendance will also be the panel which will consist of the Campus Principal, Exhibition mentor, min. one additional staff member, Campus Administrator, and min. one additional community member (**NOTE:** can be the parent(s) of the student for smaller campuses). These individuals will be responsible for grading the students' oral presentations.

The audience will also consist of the other 12th grade students, along with their parents and whomever else chooses to attend. The Grade 11 students are highly encouraged to attend. These individuals will not be part of the grading process.

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Students on ILPs

A student who is on an Individualized Learning Plan (ILP) may be exempted from this presentation-style format; however, it will be reviewed case by case. If there is a student that you think would benefit from just presenting with the panel, then a collaborative decision should be made between the Campus Principal and Student Success Leader. A request will then be submitted to your region's Educational Director for review.

Zoom

The Senior Exhibition presentations at each campus will be streamed via Zoom for the entire duration of the event. This will allow for other community members, particularly those from other localities, to watch the presentations. Campus Principals, please set up a Zoom ID that you would like to use for the event and send it to your region's Curriculum & Instructional Specialist by **Friday, March 2, 2018**. This will be compiled into a document and released.

Video Submission

We will be compiling student abstracts and videos from all four regions to release to the community. Please have all Grade 12 students submit their abstract and video to the following SmartSheet below by **Friday, March 2, 2018**.
